Program

Amanda Hughes, chief strategy officer for the Stanislaus Community Foundation, provided an update on how nonprofits are serving and surviving during the pandemic. The Community Foundation has been able to help by dispersing money, communicating and giving nonprofits access to how to use technology, finance planning, etc.

Amanda said nonprofits have lost revenue – most fund-raising events were canceled – and face higher expenses in improving their technology and seeing more people in need. The foundation has worked closely with United Way, which is overseeing help for basic needs – mental health, food and rental assistance. The foundation has focused on youth programs, arts and culture, job development and technical assistance so nonprofits can receive more grants.

What they're learning: There will be nonprofits that won't survive – perhaps as many as a third, according to one national forecast. The demand for food bank services will continue to rise, and some nonprofits will merge. More info is available at www.stanislauscf.org
